Thank you for writing to express your support for a voter referendum on whether to allow grocery and package stores to sell alcoholic beverages on Sundays.

As you know, this has been a challenging issue for the state legislature. While many Georgians believe Sunday alcohol sales should be allowed, others feel just as strongly that alcohol should not be sold on Sunday.

As a Georgian with strong religious beliefs, I oppose Sunday sales of alcohol for individual religious reasons. However, I recognize we live in a democracy where the wishes of the majority must be respected. For this reason, I have not opposed a referendum that will allow voters to choose whether or not to allow Sunday sales.

While I would vote against such a change at the ballot box, I do not believe the legislature should deny the voters of our state a chance to make this choice for themselves and their community. Rather, I applaud you for taking an active role in the political process and expressing your views.
