

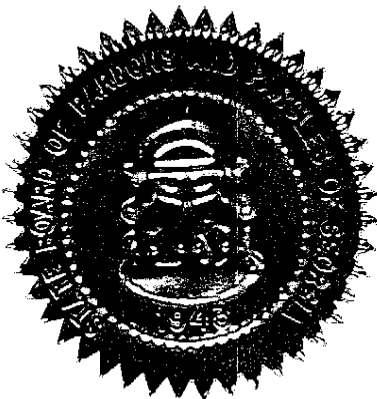




COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE OF DEATH

- WHEREAS: Upon the 28th day of October, 1994, a sentence of death was imposed on the defendant in the case of The State of Georgia v. Tommy Lee Waldrip, 335983, Indictment Number 91-CR-300-C, before the Superior Court of Dawson County; and,
- WHEREAS: An order of the Superior Court of Dawson County, dated the 23rd day of June, 2014, directs that Tommy Lee Waldrip shall be executed by the Department of Corrections during a certain period of time commencing at noon on the 10th day of July, 2014, and ending at noon on the 17th day of July, 2014; and,
- WHEREAS: The State Board of Pardons and Paroles having received, on behalf of Tommy Lee Waldrip, an application for clemency requesting that the Board exercise its authority to enter an order commuting the sentence of Tommy Lee Waldrip; and,
- WHEREAS: The State Board of Pardons and Paroles has reviewed and considered all of the facts and circumstances of the offender and his offense, the clemency application, argument, testimony, and opinion in support of and against clemency;
- THEREFORE: Pursuant to the provisions of Article IV, Section II, Paragraph II (a) and (d) of the Constitution of the State of Georgia, on behalf of the Members of the State Board of Pardons and Paroles, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that the sentence of death imposed on Tommy Lee Waldrip be **COMMUTED** this day to a sentence of life without parole.
